Call for Conference Proposals - Due by 15th June, 2018

CALL FOR PROPOSALS—PROPOSAL THEMES

Proposals are invited that address ONE OR MORE of the core sectors of NENA's work, and/or key elements of how we build a new economy, as follows:

(i) The core sectors of NENA's work:

- Ecological economics, sustainability and the natural world
- Indigenous economics
- Fair food systems and regenerative agriculture
- Energy and waste management
- Transport
- Land and property systems, housing, ownership
- Social justice, economic democracy and collaborative governance
- Law, regulation and policy
- Money and finance
- Technology and platform co-operativism
- Work, employment and enterprise—including cooperatives

(ii) Key elements of *how* we build a new economy/strengthen the commons:

- Advocacy, organising and creating systems change to build the new economy
- Communications, media and journalism
- Power, gender, culture and value
- Just transitions and localisation
- Inner dimensions of building the new economy – including the role of mindfulness, spiritual practice and healthy cultures of collaboration.
- Government, industry and international partnerships

PARTICIPATION OPTIONS

- Academic papers – 15 min presentations
- Practitioner papers – 15 minute presentations
- Panel discussions and facilitated workshops – 20 to 50 minutes
- Problem solving clinics, training, professional development – up to 50 minutes
- New Economy Lab – propose an experiment to conduct with willing participants (e.g. it could be about currencies / sharing systems, etc.), before, during, or after the conference, and use a 50 min conference session to review it or start it
- New Economy Change Projects – 50 minute sessions for those who want to propose specific social change projects and who intend to continue these projects after the conference
- Discussion groups, arts projects, debates, working group meetings – 50 minutes
- Facilitated games—30-50 minutes
