- Called a meeting to explore community buyout options
- Caroola was sold well before we organised

How to design these in?

- Customers and Farmers both own the coop as members
- CSA type arrangement between them
- Lease to own land first right of refusal contract
- Regenerative / soil friendly practices
- Diversity through Enterprise Stacking
- Replicate to maintain its local nature

Form of coop?

- Multi-stakeholder different member types
- One member type with many roles

- Both hard to design
- Multi-stakeholder coops are rare in australia
- Proven, resilient model overseas

Enterprise Stacking

- enterprises are run as distinct businesses.
- Farmers can work in one enterprise, in multiple enterprises, and off farm
 - chicken eggs
 - chicken meat
 - market garden
 - aquaculture
 - tree crops

Access to the coop - \$\$\$

Membership may be pricey – how can I afford to join?

- Farmers CSA premium over time
- Customers CSA premium
- Customers do not have to be owners, but owners will get priority in hard times, and other benefits

Where to from here?

- Recruit, activate and co-ordinate volunteers
- Recruit Farmer and customer members
- Investigate pre-payment model for Co-op development work, like:
- Feasibility studies
- Legal advice
- Co-op design advice
- Continue talking with ORICoop
